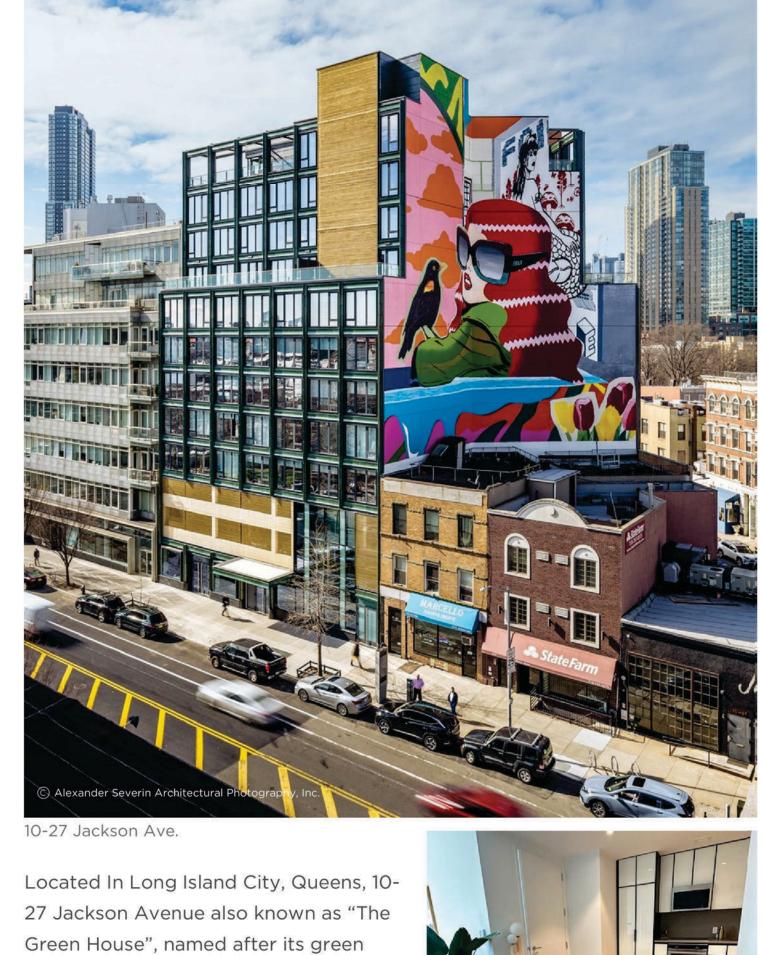

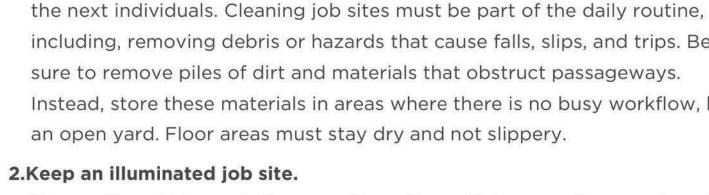

1.Keep a clean job site.

You can't avoid hazards if you can't see them. Make sure all areas of work have sufficient illumination. Also, make sure that you carry a source of illumination just in case you find a poorly lit location and need to safely navigate through. Areas with insufficient illumination should be closed off to all work activity, until adequate temporary lighting can be provided for within the area.

4. Use gloves and wear the proper footwear. a. Construction sites are works-in-progress, often with incomplete and uneven

walking surfaces. All Construction Management personnel should have construction boots that meet OSHA's standards for puncture-resistant and slip-resistant footwear, including hard-toe protection. Safety boots should also be securely worn and tied properly to provide supportive stabilization of your ankles and feet. b. Why gloves? Because keeping your hands protected and out of your pockets is important to reduce falls - gloves improve holding onto

handrails, while keeping your hands out of your pockets helps with maintaining balance and breaking falls if they do happen. 5. Encourage all workers to speak up.

Teammates and trade workers often stay quiet rather than ask questions, even if they don't know the right way to do something or if they've

identified an issue that may lead to an unsafe situation. So never be dismissive of anyone's observations regarding safety - be attentive, respectful, and encouraging when anyone shares safety concerns. 6.Stay out of busy work areas. Try to avoid walking through areas where dense trade activity is occurring.

through an area where construction work is occurring might pose hazards,

such as falling objects. So, unless it is essential to your work duties it can be helpful to avoid dense work areas and keep them clear of extra people. 7. Maintain awareness of surroundings. Make sure that everyone on a construction team stays aware of their surroundings. On a construction site, there are usually several different jobs taking place at one time, so knowing what's going on in each area

can help avoid risk and keep team members safe from incidents or injuries.

As trade workers typically have a great focus on their job duties, traveling

Management teams have a brief pre-day safety awareness meeting - 15 minutes or less - where Superintendents and Project Managers discuss all scheduled activities and deliveries anticipated for the FOLLOWING Day.

8. Make it your problem. Never assume someone else will "deal with" an unsafe condition or address unsafe actions. If you see something unsafe - stop and address it. If you

are unsure of what to do - call a teammate - but don't just walk away

believing it is someone else's problem ... make it your problem to solve.

Project Updates

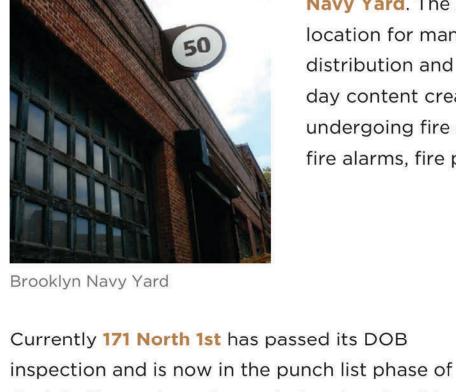

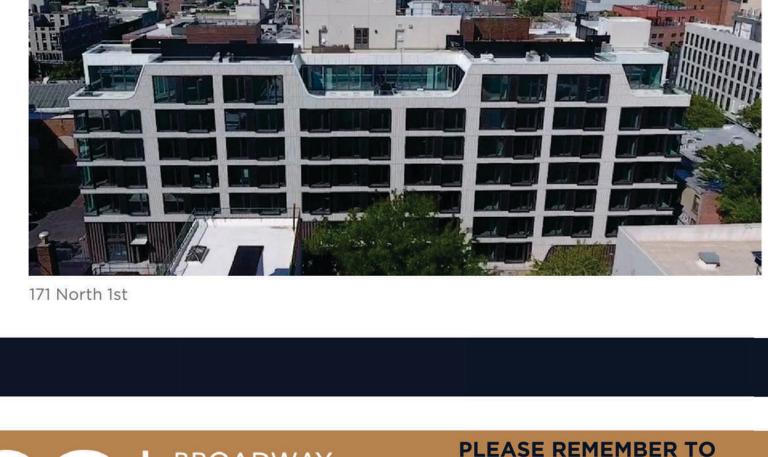

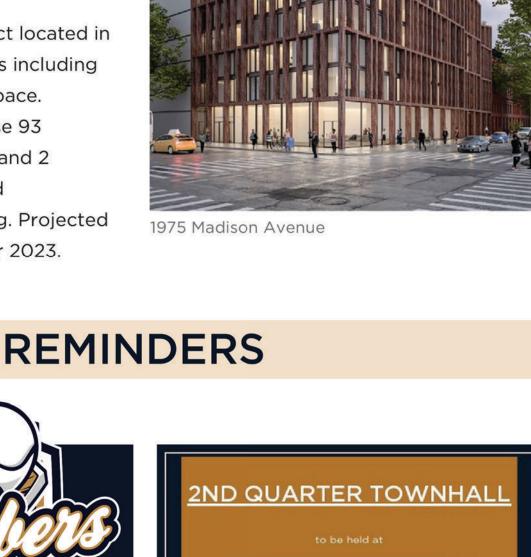
